

MAIN REGISTER

HOW TO USE THE FILES!

Each file is divided up in accordance with the classification system for motor vehicle repairs now in general use in the motor trade in Sweden.

The Service Manuals and Workshop Bulletins are inserted in their respective files on the basis of the registration numbers of the publications concerned. Service Manuals have a single-figure registration number (the Part number) and are inserted in the respective section in product number sequence, e.g. N 84, F 85, F 86, N 86 and so on. Workshop Bulletins have a two-figure registration number (Group number), as well as a consecutive serial number within each group.

To find information in the file, first refer to the register on the right-hand side of this page, after which the section required can easily be found by using the numbered tabs on the division pages. As mentioned above, the Service Manuals can be found in product number sequence within the section concerned, and the Workshop Bulletins in Group number sequence and serial number sequence within each group. On the back of each division page there is a list of the groups included in the section concerned.

FOREWORD

This file is a complement to the service manuals which are issued collectively for the various types of vehicles. This file is used mainly for those bulletins and manuals which modify or supplement the instructions in the main service manuals.

The main service manuals and the publications included in this file contain all the information required to carry out workshop repair and adjustment work on Volvo vehicles. Information and descriptions of an elementary nature have not been included. We have, however, included more detailed descriptions concerning new features which, from the point of view of function and repair technique, differ from earlier designs.

The various bulletins and manuals are, where possible, divided up as follows:

1. Description
2. Repair instructions
3. Fault tracing
4. Tools
5. Specifications

Apart from the specifications given in each manual, separate part or bulletin, which only concern the component part involved, all the specifications for the vehicle types in question have been concentrated in one single section in part 0.

The instructions concerning repair work generally assume the use of special tools and are based on experience obtained from our method studies. We should like to point out, however, that most of the work can be done in several different ways so that the method we describe is only one of the many ways of arriving at the same result. If you follow our instructions, however, you can count on a good result in the shortest possible time.

At the end of every service manual there is a page reserved for "References to Workshop Bulletins". The intention of this is that when a workshop bulletin is issued which modifies earlier instructions in the service manual, the reference number should be entered on this page with information concerning the modification in question.
